1. What are cookies and similar technologies?

Cookies are small text files that websites store on a visitor's device. They are used to uniquely identify your browser, store settings, and help you navigate between pages efficiently. We also use:

- **Local Storage:** Technologies like HTML5 that provide cookie-equivalent functionality but can store larger amounts of data on your device.
- **Web Beacons:** Also known as pixel tags or clear GIFs, used to demonstrate that a webpage or email was accessed or certain content clicked.

In this policy, we refer to all these technologies collectively as "**cookies**".

2. How we use cookies

We use both **persistent cookies** (which stay on your device for a set period) and **session cookies** (which are deleted once you close your browser).

- **First-party cookies:** Set directly by us.
- **Third-party cookies:** Set by our partners, such as analytics and payment providers.

3. Categories of cookies we use

- **Essential Cookies:** Necessary for the website to function, enabling basic features like page navigation and access to secure areas. Some parts of the website will not work if these are blocked.
- **Functionality / Performance Cookies:** Used to enhance the performance of our Services and remember your preferences.
- **Analytics Cookies:** Help us understand how our Services are performing and being used. We use tools such as **Google Analytics** and **Yandex Metrika** to create reports about user interaction.
- **Advertising Cookies:** We and our third-party advertising partners use these to collect information about your interactions to serve ads that may be relevant to your interests.

4. Email Interaction Technology

Our emails may contain web beacons to tell us whether they are opened and verify clicks on links within the email. This helps us understand the performance of our campaigns and improve our content. To prevent this, you can choose to receive emails in plain text rather than HTML.

5. How you can control cookies

Depending on your location, you may be presented with a cookie banner to provide permission for non-essential cookies. We only set non-essential cookies with your consent. You can also control cookies through:

- **Browser Settings:** Most browsers allow you to remove or reject cookies. For more information, visit www.allaboutcookies.org.

- **Mobile Settings:** Use your device settings to limit the use of advertising IDs for interest-based advertising.
- **Google Analytics Opt-out:** You can opt out of Google Analytics by installing the browser plug-in available at: <https://tools.google.com/dlpage/gaoptout>.
- **Ad Industry Tools:** Use platforms like optout.aboutads.info or optout.networkadvertising.org to limit interest-based advertising.

6. "Do Not Track" Signals

Some browsers send "Do Not Track" signals to online services. We currently **do not respond** to these signals.
